However, the most critical announcement to many was the goal of having a modified restoration of the AVMA health insurance plan due to changes in the laws made with the current administration of the federal government. This new AVMA Trust will start with 13 states whose state laws allow the newly

formed Trust to operate within their state. This will hopefully be seen as early as July but should be in effect for sure by Jan 2020. This coverage is not going to be available only to the veterinarian, but to all employees as well. He also announced a \$30.00 dues increase for this upcoming year.

We were also graced to have Dr. Mike Strain, our Commissioner of Agriculture attending. He had quite a number of legislative issues to report on. However, everyone's practical concern about the status of CBD and cannabinoid products was at the top of the list. The bottom line is that any

recommendation or prescribing of any of these products is still (for now) illegal in the state of Louisiana. Breaking this law can indeed, result in action from the Louisiana Board of Veterinary Medicine.

As we leave 2018 behind and start 2019, We all look forward to a year of growth and new expectations. I hope and pray that yours will be all you are hoping for. May you have

great discernment and great success on all that your hands touch. I cannot speak for everyone, but I can say for myself, veterinary medicine has been a "larger than life" experience. After seeing and traveling as a veterinarian around the world to Africa, Asia, Middle and South America, and Haiti I can say that we are more than fortunate here in America to be veterinarians and must realize and cherish this.

Additionally, the LVMA will continue to fund and work with our lobbyists who have done an exceptional job at keep our voice in the game.


